### RECEPTION CLASS PLACES 2019

In September 2018 the Local Authority will be issuing forms to those parents of pupils transferring to Reception next September 2019. The school will distribute these and it is important that parents sign to confirm receipt of the forms. Parents must ensure they return the forms to the Local Authority before the deadline stated. In the event of there being more applications than available places, and after the admission of children with a statement of Special Educational Need/Educational Health Care Plan which names our academy, places will be allocated against the criteria set out below.

1. Looked after children (LAC), and children who were looked after but ceased to be so by reason of adoption, a resident order or special guardianship order.
2. Concurrent sibling link (an older brother or sister attending the academy at the same time and residing at the same address to include adoptive siblings, half siblings, step siblings and long term fostered children or the child of the parent/carer's partner where the child for whom the academy place is sought is living in the same family unit at the same address as the sibling).
3. Children living nearest the academy. Where there are places for some, but not all applicants meeting a particular criterion, children living nearest the academy will receive the higher priority.

If your child has ever been involved with any services and have ceased to be, school needs to be informed so that the correct criteria can be applied in the event of oversubscription. Parents can speak confidentially to the Head Teacher and as always any information will be treated in the strictest confidence.
