Social Distancing Guidance from the Department for Education and Public Health England

The government is committed to doing everything possible to allow all children to go back to school safely, to support their wellbeing and education and help working parents. The government's plan is for all students to return to school in March 2021 and further guidance has been <u>published</u>. Wrap-around care for school age children and formal childcare can restart over the summer.

Essential measures include:

- a requirement that people who are ill stay at home
- robust hand and respiratory hygiene
- enhanced cleaning arrangements
- active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- formal consideration of how to reduce contacts and maximise distancing between those in school wherever possible and minimise potential for contamination so far as is reasonably practicable

How contacts are reduced will depend on the school's circumstances and will (as much as possible) include:

- grouping children together
- avoiding contact between groups
- arranging classrooms with forward facing desks
- staff maintaining distance from pupils and other staff as much as possible
