<u>Year 3</u> worked really hard this term when they had an afternoon at the multiskills festival at Temple Park. As a class we really enjoyed it and had lots of fun.



The children in Year One have been learning all about measuring in Mathematics. Last week we went out onto the school yard and measured a real life sized T-Rex. First we used the internet to find out how big an actual T-Rex was. Vincent read the information and Miss Hall recorded it on a whiteboard. Then we went outside and using metre rulers we measured how tall and how long the T-Rex was, counting the metres together. We then marked it out using cones and then finally drew a life size dinosaur using chalk. The children then took turns to draw and label the features including eyes, claws and teeth. At playtime the rest of the school came out and we shared the chalk with the older children who helped us to draw even more life size dinosaurs.
